The "Thinker". Large compact figure of a seated man which comes from Karditsa of Thessaly and is from the period of 4500-3300 B.C.





"The Nurse". Clay figurine of a woman sitting on a stool with an infant in her arms coming from Sesklo of Thessaly and is from the period of 4800-4500 B.C.





Spherical clay vase with polychrome decoration which comes from Dimini of Magnesia and is from the period of 5300-4800 B.C.






Gold pin which is decorated with birds on its head. These birds are looking at different sides. This comes from Poliochni of Lemnos island and is from the middle of 3rd millennium B.C.



Cycladic Antiquities



Marble statuette of a standing male figure playing a musical instrument which is called "the double flute". It comes from Keros island and is from the period of 2800-2300 B.C.

Female statue with folded arms. This statue is constructed from the famous Parian marble. It comes from Amorgos island and is from the period of 2800-2300 B.C.




Antiquities of Thera Island



Large jug vase with painted decoration of grapes. It comes from Akrotiri area and is from the period of the 16th century B.C.

Large jug vase with colourful bird decoration. The formation of the bird depicts its impressive movement and vitality. It comes from Akrotiri area and is from the period of the 16th century B.C.



Mycenaean Antiquities



Gold death-mask known as the "mask of Agamemnon" who was the king of Mycenae and Argos. This archaeological treasure comes from his grave in Mycenae area and is from the 16th century B.C.



Mycenaean Antiquities



Ritual vase named as "rython" in the shape of a shoe. It comes from Voula area in Attica and is from the 14th century B.C.
