### FACTS ABOUT THE UK - Visiting a bar or a pub

#### Ordering drinks

When two people drink together, it is customary for them to buy drinks for each other in turn.

When a group of people drink together, it is customary for one person to buy drinks for everybody in the group. This is called a round of drinks.

*A pint of \_\_\_\_\_ (name of beer lager, stout, cider), please.*

*Half (= half a pint) of \_\_\_\_\_, please.*

*A pint of Best (= Best Bitter), please.*

You don't tip the barman/barmaid, but you can offer him/her a drink.

#### Barman/Barmaid:

*Straight glass or handle?*

*Gin and tonic, please.*

*Ice and lemon? or Ice and a slice?*

*Large/Double (=double measure) whisky, please.*

*Ice?*

*Rocks (ice-cubes), as in Bourbon on the rocks, please.*





### Offering drinks

*What would you like?*

*What will you have?*

*What are you drinking?*

*What's yours?*

*Drinks are on me. ("on" = paid for by)*

*Drinks are on the house. (= free)*

### With a group:

*It's my round.*

*I'm in the chair. (= I'm buying this round.)*

*Whose round is it?*

*It's John's round.*

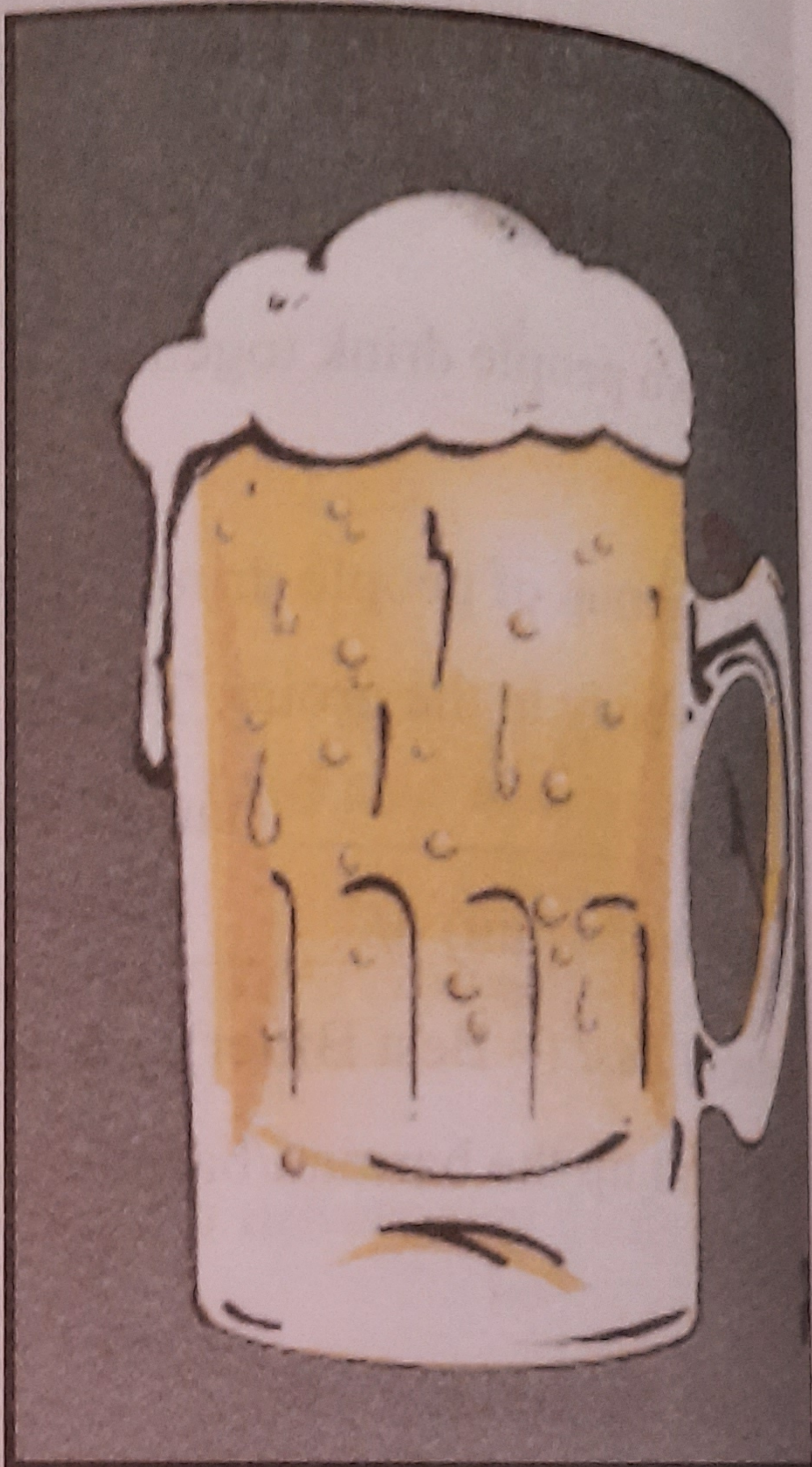
