
Τρίτη δραστηριότητα e-twinning

Στην τρίτη φάση του προγράμματος, ζητήθηκε από όλους τους συμμετέχοντες να παρουσιάσουν τον αγαπημένο τους ήρωα, έναν άνθρωπο που θαυμάζουν προσωπικά ή αποτελεί εξέχουσα προσωπικότητα στη χώρα τους. Το ψηφιακό εργαλείο που χρησιμοποιήθηκε για την παρουσίαση των εργασιών ήταν το canva και η εξοικείωση των μαθητών μας με τη συγκεκριμένη εφαρμογή έγινε στο μάθημα της πληροφορικής. Τα παιδιά είχαν την ευκαιρία να ενεργοποήσουν τις γνώσεις τους τόσο στην χρήση της αγγλικής γλώσσας όσο και στην χρήση νέων τεχνολογιών (δημιουργία αφίσας) και το αποτέλεσμα της εργασίας τους ήταν εξαιρετικό. Το ενδιαφέρον, βέβαια, ανέβηκε κατακόρυφα, όταν παρουσιάστηκαν στους μαθητές μας οι ήρωες των παιδιών των άλλων χωρών και συνειδητοποίησαν ότι γνώριζαν και θαύμαζαν αρκετούς από αυτούς (π.χ. από το χώρο του αθλητισμού και της μουσικής). 


Pythagoras of Samios was an important Greek philosopher, mathematician, geometer and music theorist.

HIS LIFE


He was born in 572 BC. in Samos and died around 490 BC. in Croton, K. Italy.

About him

Konstantinos "Kostas" Kenteris, also spelled as Konstadinos "Costas" Kederis (Greek: Κωνσταντίνος "Κώστας" Κεντέρης pronounced [konsta dinos ce deris]: born July 11. 1973) is a Greek former athlete. He won gold medals in the 200 metres at the 2000 Summer Olympics.[1] the 2001 World Championships in Athletics and the 2002 European Championships in Athletics, making him the only European sprinter (along with Linford Christie) to win the gold medal in all three major competitions and the only European World Champion in the 200 metres races. Additionally, he has won two gold, three silver and two bronze medals in the European Cup, as well as three gold medals in the 200 metres at the Athens Grand Prix Tsiklitiria. He is also a 14-time golden medalist at the Greek Athletics Championships and a five-time golden medalist at the Greek Indoor Athletics Championships. He withdrew from the 2004 Summer Olympics, held in his home country, after a doping violation (failed to attend drug test) 121

Kenteris was named the Greek Male Athlete of the Year three times, for the years 2000, 2001, and 2002. He was named the Best Balkan Athlete of the Year two times, for the years 2000 and 2001.

Anna Ntountounaki (Greek: Άννα Ντουντουνάκη, born 9
September 1995) is a Greek swimmer, competing for
Panathinaikos on club level.[2]

She competed in the women's 100 metre butterfly event at the 2016 Summer Olympics.[3] She finished 17th in the heats with a time of 58.27 seconds which was a new national record. She did not qualify for the semifinals.[4] At the 2020 Summer Olympics she finished 9th, achieving a new national record with a time of 57.25 seconds. Also, she won the gold of 2020 European Aquatics Championships sharing this title with Marie Wattel.
