USEFUL PHRASES for online meetings



- Hello, are you there? Can everyone see/hear me clearly?
- Hello everyone. Welcome. I'm XY. Who are you?



- We can see you, but we can't hear you.
- Can you hear me now?



- You're on mute!
- Can you unmute your microphone?
- Please mute your microphone, when you are note speaking. We can hear noises in the background.



- Could you turn your video on?
- Can you see me now?
- You've frozen. Can you try turning your video off?



- Sorry, I didn't catch that, the connection is bad.
- Could you repeat that, you're breaking up a bit.
- Oh dear, we've lost you!
- Could you write that in the chat box please?

TURNED OFF when you are NOT speaking.

Raise your hand, if you want to say something. Put down your hand when you are done speaking.

If you have a problem, write your questions in the chat.



- 2.) Talk about your nation's Christmas traditions/ winter traditions focussing on your group's topic. Find out what you do similarly or differently in the three countries.
- 3.) Together, create your Christmas card(s) with the google slides for your group. Write down Christmas wishes on your Christmas card, make sure that you include traditions from all three countries and include the photos/drawings/pictures/clip art (creative commons).
- 4.) Prepare to explain your Christmas card in the meeting later.
- **5.) Fast finishers:** a.) Help your teacher decide on a Christmas song created by AI that represents your country for the Christmas song contest. b.) You may create more than one card with your group.
