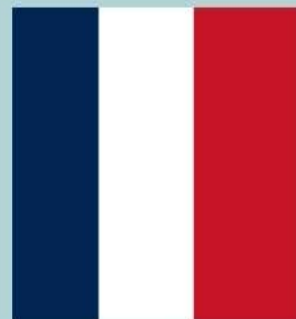

When he was angry he would strike his trident in the water, shaking the waves and launching storms.

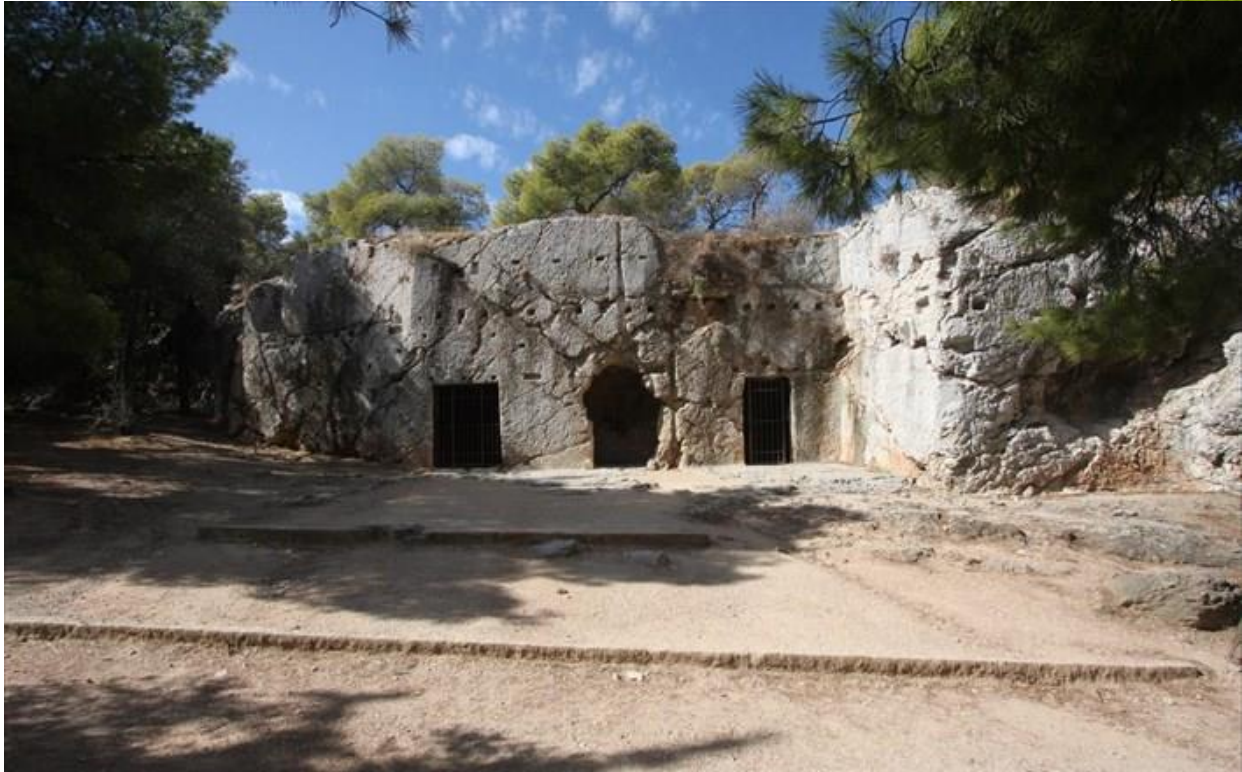


Athena and Poseidon dispute over Athens. Athena and Poseidon claimed the same city. So they climbed the rock of the Acropolis and before the Athenians decided that whoever offered the inhabitants the most beautiful gift, would get it. Poseidon hit one side of the hill with his trident and immediately gushed a spring with water. The people marveled, but the water was as salty as the water of the sea, which was the kingdom of Poseidon, and so it was not very useful. Athena's gift was an olive tree, which was better, since it provided the city with food, oil and timber. Thus, Athena won the duel and named the city Athens.

The nymphs were small deities of nature that lived on forested mountains, such as Pelion, and were directly connected to the water. As there can be no vegetation without the existence of water, the nymphs became symbols of nature fertility and were closely associated with the worship of Panos, whom the legend wants to accompany, play and dance with in the forested mountains, near the fountains . The relationship between nymphs and healing is evidenced by the myths that tell that the mothers of great doctors were nymphs. Thus the Centaur of Hands, who lived in Pelion, was the son of Saturn and the nymph Filira and was married to the nymph Hariklo, daughter of Apollo.
