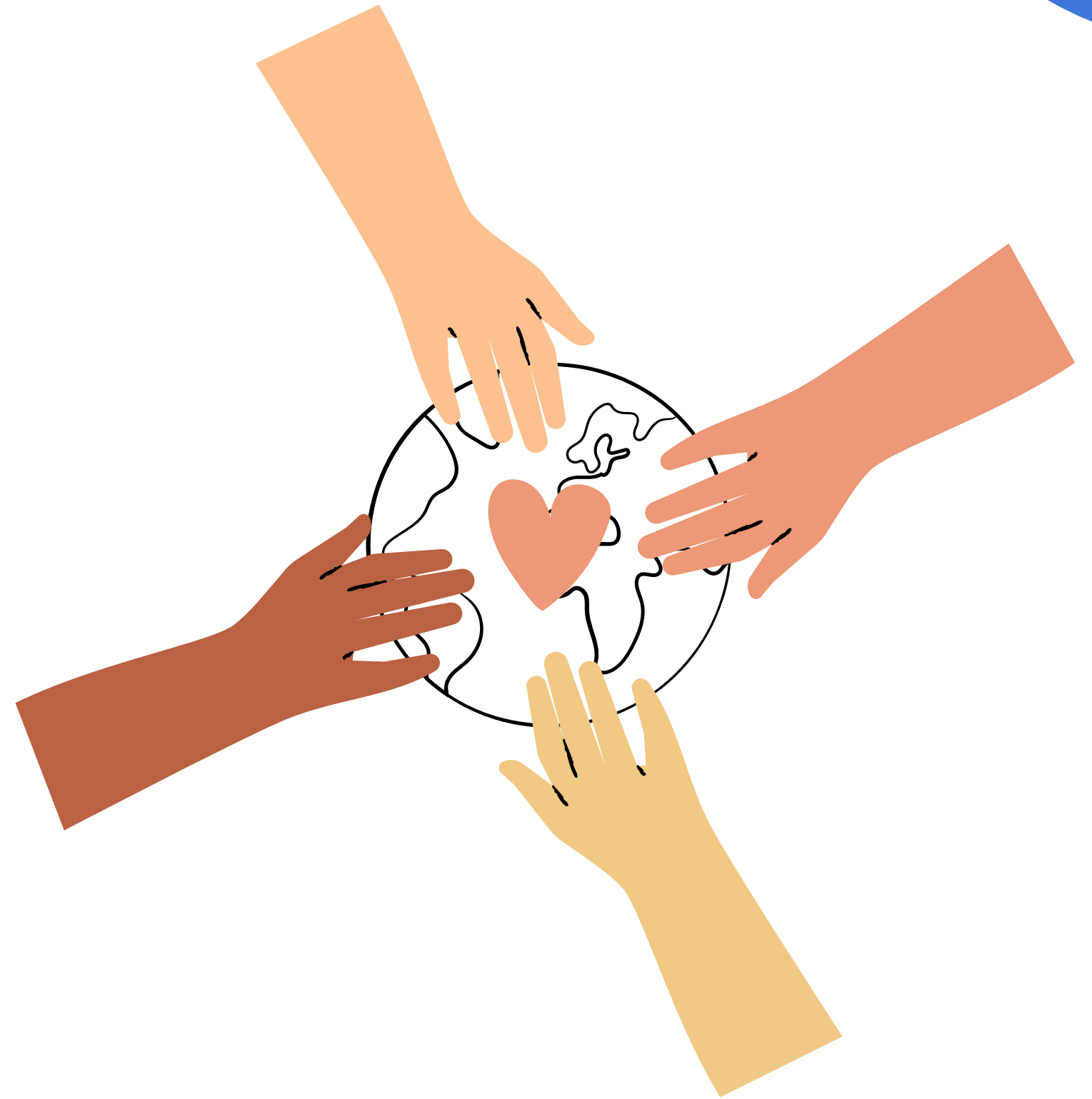

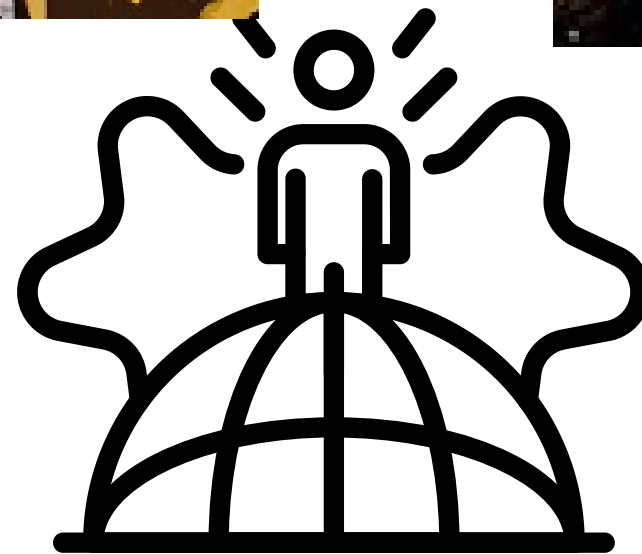

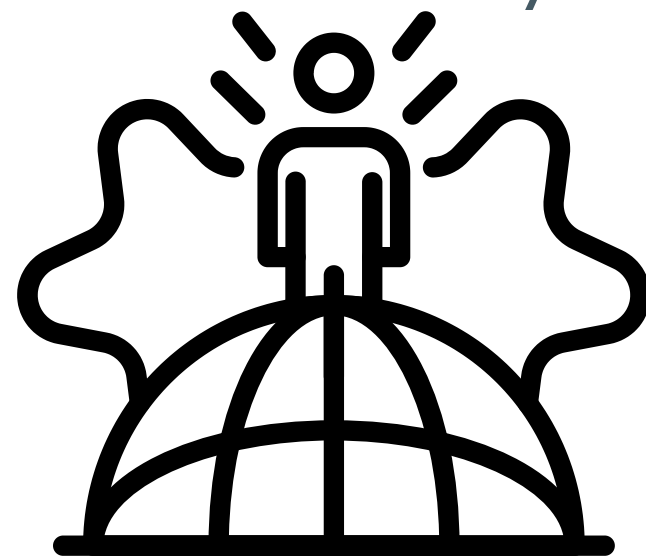

Democracy: Then and now

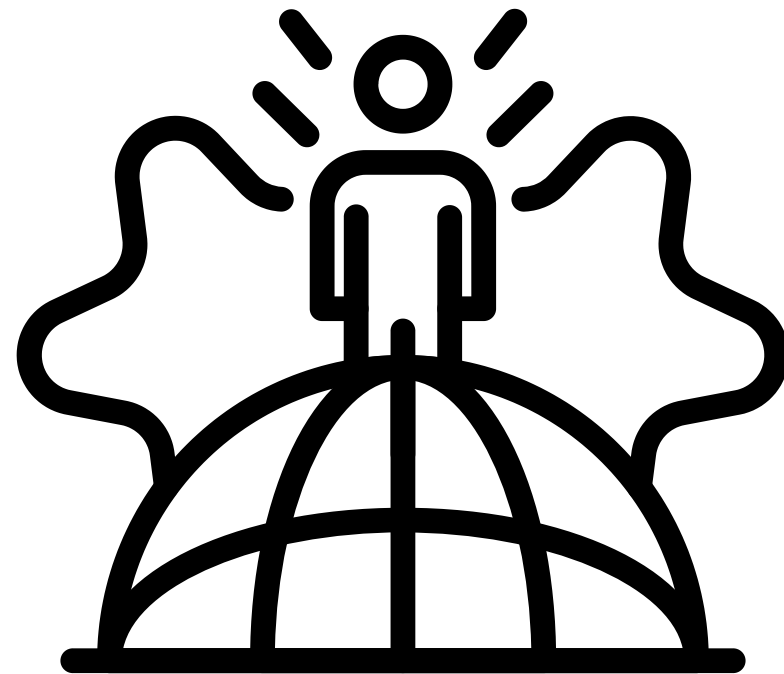
In Athenian democracy, not only did citizens participate in a direct democracy whereby they themselves made the decisions by which they lived, but they also actively served in the institutions that governed them, and so they directly controlled all parts of the political process.

In modern societies, open discussion helps people understand different perspectives and issues, making them better-informed voters and participants. When people feel heard and can express their reviews freely, they are more likely to take part in democratic processes, protesting or community meetings.

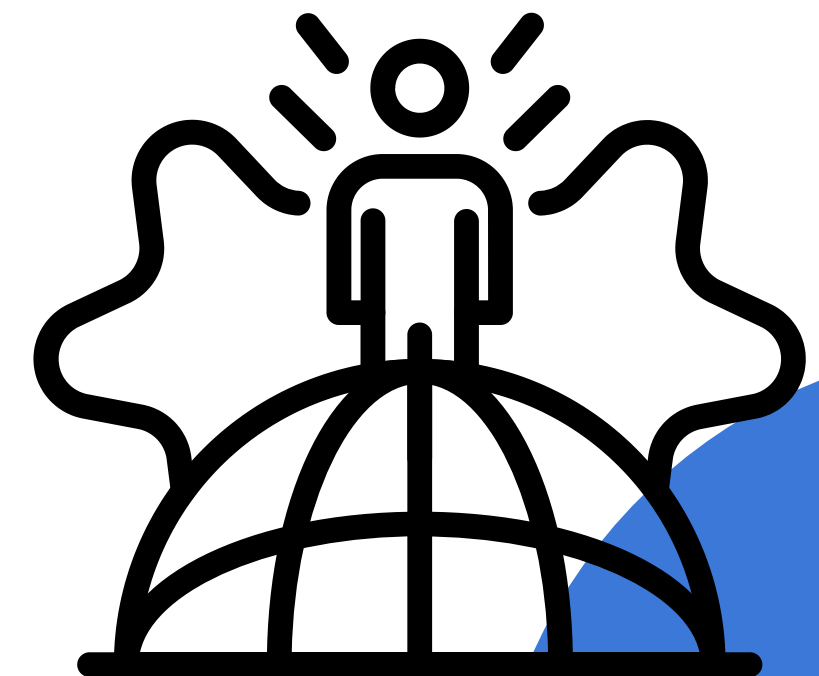
