- This painting won the Golden prize at the International Exhibition in 1900 in Paris.
- The painting is exhibited at the National Gallery-Athens.
- This painting is an older variant of the 1894-1896 painting with a similar theme, but quite darker.

ANALYSIS of the children's recital

- There are 7 people; 1 baby, 1 woman,
 1 girl and 4 boys.
- The main colours are yellow, orange and green.
- The instruments we can make out are a drum, a trumpet and a harmonica.
- The house is old.
- The people seem to be happy.
- Maybe there is a feast.
- The light is coming from the two windows.

- In Munich he lived for 17 years where he worked in his studio, painting mythological scenes and portraits following various styles.
