

Present Simple

Use: Present Simple refers to actions that are generally true or habitual. The action does not necessarily take place at the actual moment of speaking, but can be at any point on the timeline that surrounds the present time.

For example:

"He rides to school."



... means it is generally the case that he rides his bike to school.
