Who was Molly Malone?

Molly Malone was a fishmonger who walked through Dublin's fair city selling fish from her wheelbarrow.



Origin of Song

However, despite the song's great fame, little is known about its musical origins, or the veracity behind the story it tells.



Unknown composer of the lyrics

The composer of the lyrics and music is not known and it is uncertain when the song originated, or even what period it is meant to depict.



Little information is known

The only definite historical information that exists comes from the lyrics themselves, which tell us that Molly was an attractive young woman from a fishmonger background. She was a fishmonger too and sold seafood by wheeling a barrow through the streets of Dublin.

A deadly fever claimed the life of young Molly Malone. Her ghost is believed to still roam Dublin's busy Moore Street fish market today.
