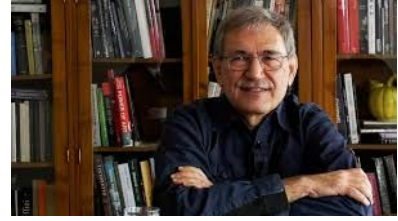
Haluk Bilginer (Actor)

He has works in the fields of cinema, theater and television and has won various awards or been nominated for these works. He has won an International Emmy Award for his work in television and is the recipient of four Golden Butterfly Awards. He received awards at the Afife Theater Awards and Sadri Alışık Awards for his works in the field of theater.



Fazıl Say (Pianist)

Throughout his career, Fazıl Say gave concerts with orchestras such as the New York Philharmonic, St. Petersburg Philharmonic, Amsterdam Concertgebouw, Vienna Philharmonic, Czech Philharmonic, Israel Philharmonic, French National Orchestra and Tokyo Symphony. The CD, which included the piano piece composed by Say, who was the president of the piano jury at the Montreux Jazz Festival in 2007, inspired by the folk song "Kara Toprak" by Turkish instrumentalist Aşık Veysel, rose to 6th place on the Billboard charts in the USA. Orhan Pamuk (Author)

Orhan Pamuk, who was chosen among the 100 most influential people in the world by Time magazine in 2006, is the first Turk to be awarded the Nobel Prize. At the award ceremony held at the Swedish Academy in 2006, he made his speech in Turkish and gave his speech the title of My Father's Suitcase. The award was presented to King Louis XVI of Sweden alone at the award ceremony held in

Rosalía (Singer)

Originally known for her contemporary interpretations of flamenco music, Rosalía; He gained international attention following several collaborations with artists such as J Balvin, The Weeknd, Bad Bunny, Lil Baby, James Blake, Daddy Yankee, Travis Scott, and Pharrell Williams. He has received various awards, including eight Latin Grammy Awards and



Antoni Gaudí (Architect)

Eight of Gaudí's works are on the UNESCO World Heritage list. Park Güell, Palau Güell and Casa Milà were included in the UNESCO World Heritage list in 1984, and the "Nativity" facade of La Sagrada Família and its underground tomb, Casa Vicens, Casa Battló and Colonia Güell Tomb were included in the UNESCO World Heritage list in 2005. Since 2013, June 10, the day Antonio died, has been celebrated as World Art



Salvador Dalí (Artist)

Dalí, who became famous for the strange and striking images in his surreal works, completed his most popular work, The Persistence of Memory, in 1931. In addition to painting, Dalí was also interested in sculpture, photography and filmmaking, and the short cartoon Destino, which he made with American animator Walt Disney, was nominated for an Academy Award in the "best short animated film" category in 2003.



ROMANIA



Mihai Eminescu (Author)

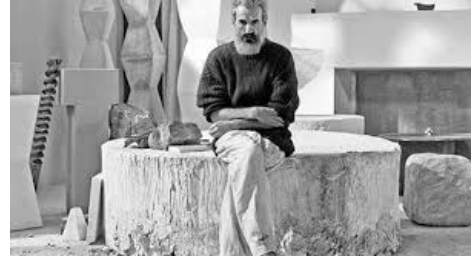
He is a romantic poet, novelist and journalist and is often cited as Romania's most famous and influential Romanian writer.

Romanian historian Nicolae Iorga considered Eminescu the spiritual father of the Modern Romanian Language. By common agreement, he is seen as the greatest Romanian poet and the one who best represents the country's poetry.



George Enescu (Violinist)

He was appointed court violinist by Queen Elisabeth of Wied of Romania. His first performance in America was in New York in 1923 as a composer, violinist and conductor with the Philadelphia Orchestra. In 1936, his only opera, *Œdipe*, was staged in Paris. In January 1937, he conducted the New York Philharmonic Orchestra.



Constantin Brancusi (Sculptor)

He is one of the leading sculptors of the international modernism movement. At the age of 8, he went to Bucharest and enrolled in the Bucharest School of Fine Arts, which taught classical higher art there. In 1903, Brancusi first went to Munich and then to Paris. He worked for two years in the workshop of Antonin Mercié, one of the teachers of the École des Beaux-Arts in Paris. Later, he accepted the position of Auguste Rodin's workshop assistant, but then left this job. Afterwards, Brancusi continued his studies of modernism and developed a



GREECE



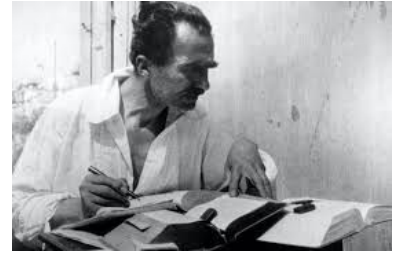
Manos Chatzidakis
(Composer)

Oscar-winning Greek composer. He composed compositions for many Ancient Greek works. In 1961, he composed "Ta paidia tou Peiraia"), which he composed and wrote the lyrics for the 1960 film Pote tin Kyriaki directed by American director Jules Dassin. He won the Academy Award for Best Original Song for the song.



El Greco (Painter)

The artist is considered a pioneer of expressionism and cubism. His personality and works inspired writers such as Rainer Maria Rilke and Nikos Kazantzakis. Although El Greco is interpreted as a unique artist, independent of general painting movements, the elongated figures and strange color choice in his paintings are considered a combination of western painting and



Nikos Kazantzakis (Author)

He is thought to be the most important Greek philosopher of the 20th century and one of the Greek writers whose works have been most translated into foreign languages. In 1910, after completing his education in Paris, he wrote the tragedy "The Master Builder", based on a popular Greek myth. "Odyssey", which he started writing in 1924 and rewrote seven times until it was published in 1938, is considered his most
