

# Let's learn about Billingsgate Roman Bath House

The Billingsgate Roman Bath House was built between the 2nd and 3rd century AD and was discovered in 1848. It comprised of a north and east wing, which had a hypocaust system and underfloor heating, around a central courtyard. Around the 3rd century a bath house containing a tepidarium, a caldarium and a frigidarium was added. It was used till the 5th century but eventually left to ruin.

Everyone can visit it from April to November every Saturday. You pay for concession 7£ and for adults 9£. The address is 101 Lower Thames Street London EC3R 6DL.
