CHALKIDA IN THE ROMAN ERA

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The Romans conquered Greece in 31BC after the battle of Actium. One of the cities occupied by the Romans was Chalkis. Chalkis became more important as the Romans improved infrastructure. An example of it is the Roman aqueduct.

The Northern Halkida exit on the ring road is where the Roman aqueduct, also known as Arches, can be seen. The Romans constructed it as a water transfer project for the city's water supply, and it is excellently maintained. The work appears to have been completed twice, first by the Romans and later by the Venetians, and, then, it was repaired by the Turks.



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
