Kamares A powerful symbol – landmark

The Roman Aqueduct, known as Kamares, is located at the northern exit of Chalkida on the ring road, a few hundred meters from the 5th Model Gymnasium of Chalkida.

The Aqueduct was constructed by the Romans to bring water from outside sources into the city. The Venetians who followed continued its use.
