About six hundred and fifty years later, in 1066, William the Conqueror came to England from France. Soon after, he began constructing the Tower of Lonon. When Henry the Eighth was king in 1509, London had around 50,000 residents. In the sixteenth century, there were 200,000, however, most of them lived in dirty and not well-maintained buildings. The poor living conditions in the seventeenth century resulted in the mass spread of a lethal disease called the plague. In The Great Fire of London in 1666, a lot of houses were burnt because they were wooden.
