see/meet you (phr) [Give sb] a hug (n)	(κάνω μια) αγκαλιά, to hold someone close to your body with your arms, usually to show that you like, love or value them.  e.g. Come here and give me a big hug.
mobile (phone) (n)	κινητό (τηλέφωνο)
	<b>e.g.</b> My <b>mobile'</b> s number is 07796 10253.
dead (adj)	νεκρός, δεν λειτουργεί
Opp.: alive	<b>e.g.</b> The phone suddenly went <b>dead.</b>
almost (adv)	σχεδόν <b>e.g.</b> He was <b>almost</b> home when the car broke down.
(look) glamorous (adj)	(φαίνομαι/δείχνω) λαμπερός, εντυπωσιακός, attractive in an exciting and special way <b>e.g.</b> She always looks <b>glamorous</b> , even at work.
chest (n)	Στήθος, the upper front part of your body, between your neck and your stomach, containing the heart and lungs.  e.g. You could see the sunburn on his arms and chest.
let [sb do sth] (v)	αφήνω, επιτρέπω (κπ να κάνει κτ) <b>e.g.</b> She wanted to go but her parents wouldn't <b>let</b> her.
Hands off! (expr)	Μακριά τα χέρια, μην αγγίζετε! e.g. Hey! Hands off my camera!
smug (adj)	Ψωνισμένος, too pleased or satisfied about something you have achieved or something you know <b>e.g.</b> She deserved her promotion, but I wish she wasn't so <b>smug</b> about it.
save (v)	κρατάω, φυλάω, αποταμιεύω, σώζω, to keep something, especially money, for use in the future <b>e.g.</b> He is trying to <b>save</b> money for a new car.
attend (v)	παρακολουθώ μαθήματα/διαλέξεις, παραβρίσκομαι, to go
Der.: attendance (n)	officially to a place, such as a particular school  e.g. I attend English classes every Tuesday.
change (v+n)	αλλάζω/αλλαγή, to become different <b>e.g.</b> That was 20 years ago and things have <b>changed</b> since then.
join (v)	έρχομαι μαζί, κάνω παρέα <b>e.g.</b> Why don't you ask your sister if she would like to <b>join</b> us for dinner?
