

Special Education

The educational policy on Special Education supports <u>inclusive education</u> of pupils with disability and special educational needs (SEN) <u>within mainstream schools</u> by providing suitable supporting structures and services.



They provide and coordinate services for children with special educational needs (SEN) at the local level, operating as decentralized units of the Ministry of Education.



- Providing diagnoses for the purpose of determining special educational needs.
- Recommending the placement of children with special educational needs in the appropriate school.
- Providing advisory services and guidance to pupils, parents and teachers.
- Providing special pedagogical support at home (in special cases).
- Providing early intervention services.

SEN students may attend:


- Ordinary mainstream school classrooms.
- Mainstream school classrooms, with concurrent support-inclusive education by Special Education teachers.
- Specially organized and suitably staffed
 Integration Classes, operating in the general and vocational education schools.



The education of SEN students can also be provided through:

- School Units of Special Education.
- Schools or classes which operate either individually or as branches of other schools in hospitals, rehabilitation centers, youth education institutes, institutes of chronic disease or services of education of rehabilitation of the Mental Health Units.
- Home tutoring, if necessary, due to severe temporary or chronic conditions which do not allow for the displacement and attendance of these pupils in schools.





The distribution of students across classes is based on:

- Grade
- Level (e.g. preliminary, middle, lower, upper)
- Diagnosis, preparedness or the special behaviors of the students, and the dynamics of the created group regardless of initial class structure based on Student Registry.



- 1. Secondary General Education
- Lower Secondary Special Education Schools (3 grades)
- Upper Secondary Special Education Schools (3 grades)

2. Secondary Vocational Training

- Special Needs Vocational Lower Secondary Schools (5 years)
- Special Needs Vocational Upper Secondary Schools (4 years)
- Special Needs Vocational Education and Training Workshops (6 years)

The Centers of Differential Diagnosis, Diagnosis and Support of Special Education Needs ($KE\Delta\Delta Y$) propose the replacement of written examinations of pupils with disabilities and special educational needs with oral or other type of examinations in the *final exams* of primary and secondary education schools and for entry exams in higher education. Moreover, they propose alternative ways of assessment for the hearing and visually impaired at all levels of education, as well as alternative ways of assessment beyond exams.
