Parents do not have to pay for tuition fees to the State to educate their children.


At the beginning of the school year, students receive all textbooks for FREE by the State.

# The secondary education

#### There are 9 types of Gymnasiums and Lyceums in Greece:

- 1. General (automatic entering from the primary school)
- 2. Athletic (entering after passing certain exams on a sport)
- 3. **Musical** (entering after passing exams on a musical instrument)
- 4. Art schools
- 5. **Exemplar** (entering after passing certain exams)
- 6. Experimental (entering after passing certain exams)
- 7. **Church** schools
- 8. School for students with special needs
- 9. Foreign language school (entering after passing exams on a foreign language)

### Junior High School

12-15 years old

3 grades

Grading system: 1-20 (base grade: 10, excellent: 20)

At the end of each year, students take written overall exams

15-18 years old

## In parallel with the mainstream schools of secondary education operate:

- Epaggelmatikes Scholes (Vocational Training Schools) operating during the day only

### Post-secondary

#### 03

- Post-secondary <u>non-higher education</u> in Greece is mainly organised around the operation of
- **Vocational Training Institutes (I.E.K.)** 
  - are post-secondary education institutions providing formal initial and further vocational education and training.
  - ➤ IEK graduates can receive a Certificate or a Diploma of Vocational Training equivalent to that of the Vocational Lyceum (EPAL) with professional rights enabling access to the labour market in both the public and the private sectors.


