animals as they develop into adulthood.

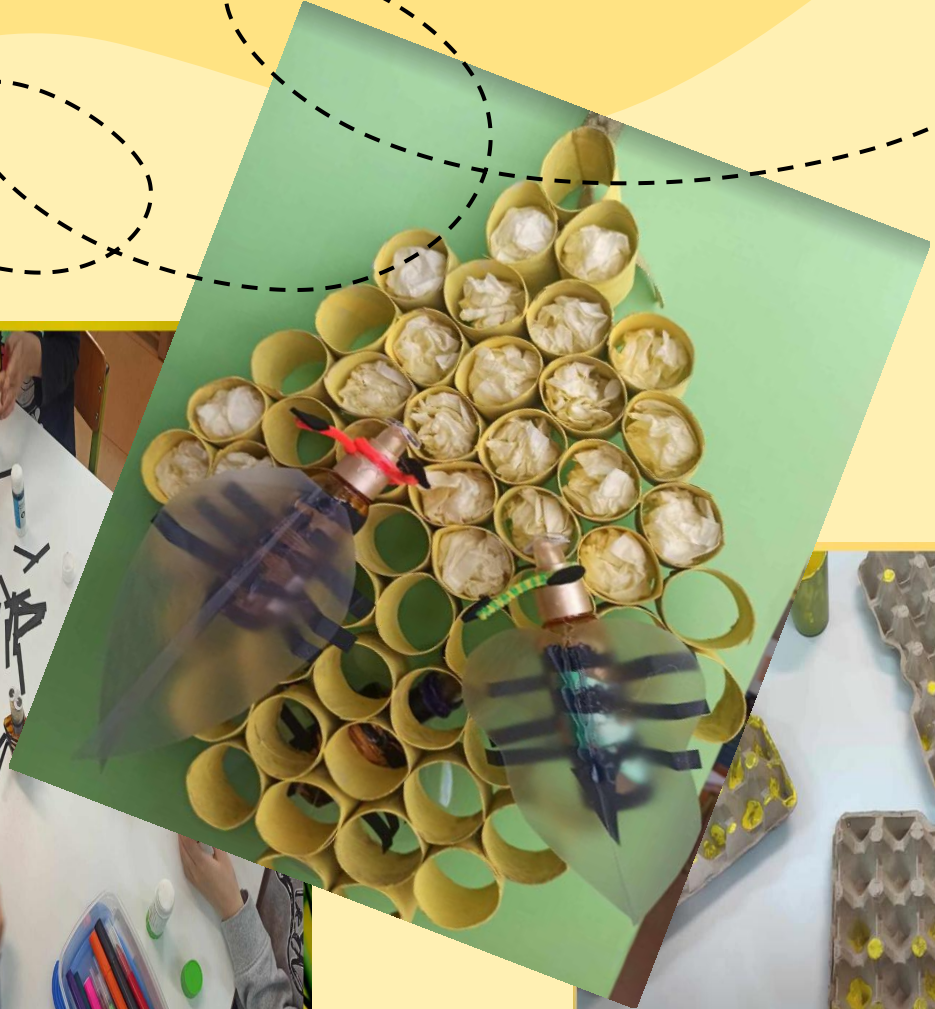


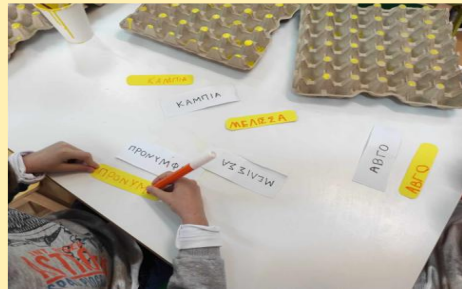

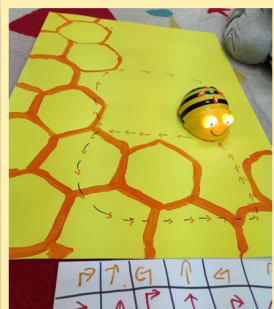
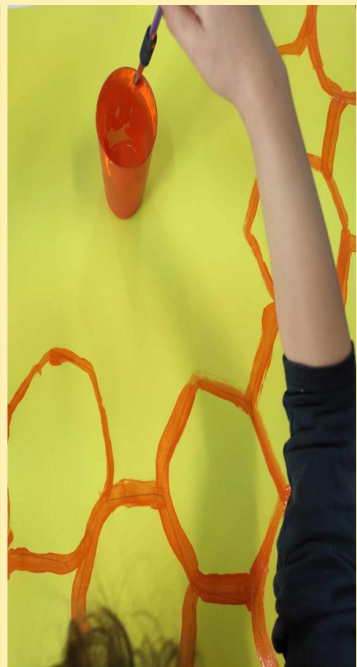




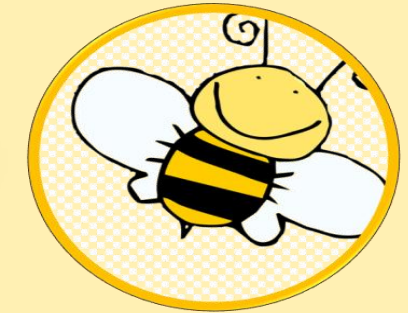
# Learn about the bee dance and program the beebot robot to “dance” like a bee...

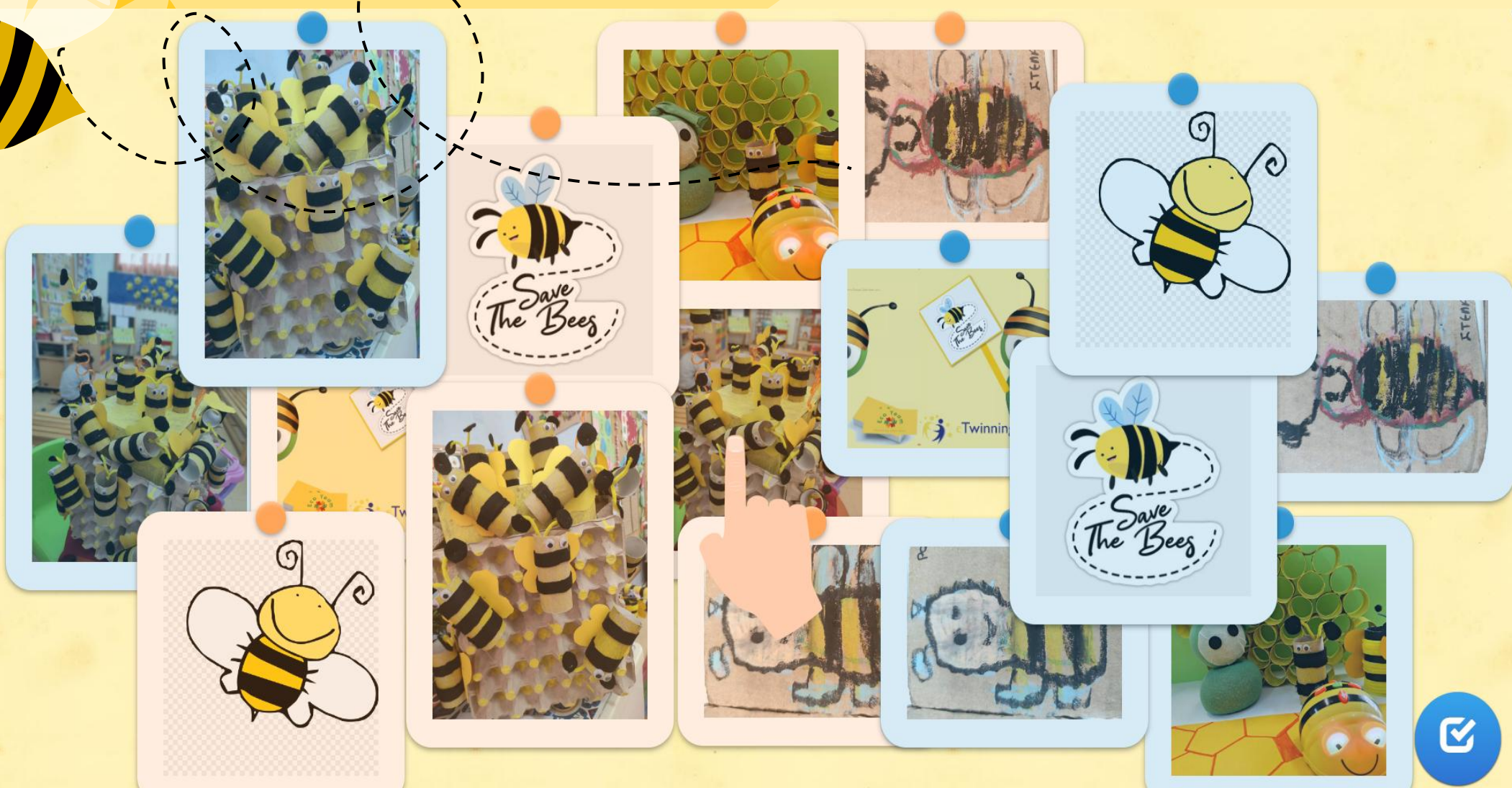

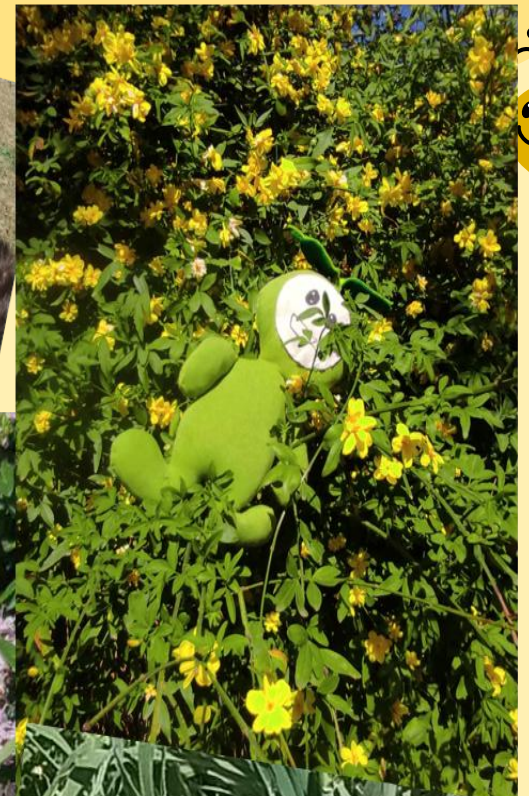

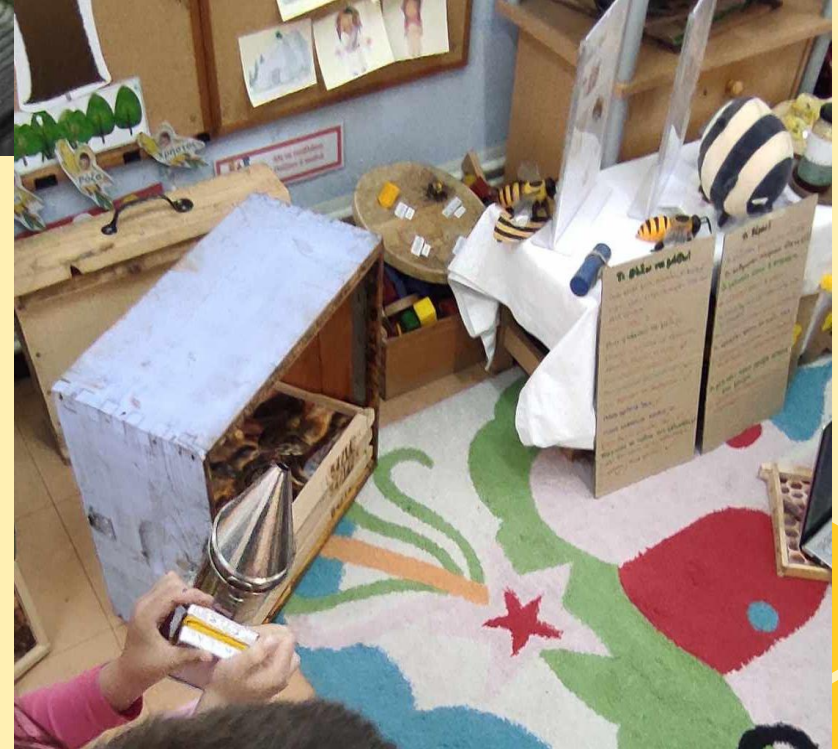
