There are some facts and records in football that are incredible.

Players, teams, coaches, all have left their mark with the records they have set.

- Lionel Messi has been awarded the Fifa Ballon d'Or 5 times
- · Barcelona is the only team in history of football to have won 6 trophies in a calendar year
- 199.854 people watch the Final of the 1950 World Cup in Maracanã Stadium
- The most goals scored by a player is 1,279, Pele

- The highest score in a match is 149-0.
- Lev Yashin has made over 150 penalty saves. He is considered to be the best goalkeeper in the history of football.
- Michael Platini holds the record for scoring most times in a Champions League Final
- Real Madrid is the only team to have won the Champions League 10 times

- Jeff Harst is the only player to have scored a hattrick in World Cup Final
- Hose Batista holds the record of having been expelled
 56 seconds after the beginning of a World Cup
 match
- Lazlo Kiss has scored the fastest hat-trick in World Cup history
- Brazil is the team to have won the World Cup the most times

- · Zist Foden has scored 13 goals in a World Cup
- The highest average goal is 5.38, in the World Cup of 1954
- · Valdemar de Brito is the first player in World Cup history who didn't score in a penalty
- · There was no draw in the World Cup of 1930

- 500 people watch the first match in the history of World Cup
- 5 players of Ecuador came from the same village in the World Cup of 1988
- 30 billion people watched the World Cup of 2006.

 That means that every person watched five games on average
- Pele is the only player to have won the World Cup 3 times

- · In the World Cup of 2006, there was no hat-trick
- · Vittorio Potso is the only coach to have won 2 World Cups
- Dino Tsof is the oldest goalkeeper to have won the World Cup
- Vava is the only player who has scored in 2 consecutive World Cup Finals
