


INTRODUCTION









- Agatha Mary Clarissa Christie was born in 15 September 1890 in Torquay, England
- She was an English writer, known throughout the world as the Queen of Crime, for her 66 detective novels and 14 short story collections


She is the most widely published and translated author of all time




Agatha received home education from early childhood till 1902

From 1902 to 1905, Agatha was sent to a girl's school in Torquay,
 Devon

 She then continued her education in Paris from 1905 to 1910 and finally returned to her surviving family in England







 As a young adult, Agatha aspired to be a writer and produced a number of unpublished short stories and novels

 She submitted them to various publishers and literary magazines, but they were all rejected








 Her debut novel "The Mysterious Affair at Styles" (1920), introduced her famous character Hercules Poirot

 Agatha soon became a celebrated writer. Many of her works have been adapted into successful films, plays and TV dramas








• She married Archibald "Archie" Christie in 1914, however, they got divorced in 1928

 In 1930, Agatha married Max Mallowan, an archaeologist, with whom she spent several months each year on expeditions in Iraq and Syria. They would remain married until her death in 1976







Agatha continued writing until 1974, though her health problems affected her writing style. She died of natural causes on 12 January 1976.




THE BOOK:

 Peril at End House is a detective novel written by British author Agatha Christie

 It was first published in the United States in February 1932 by Dodd, Mead and Company

- The novel was well received when first published, with the plot remarked as unusually ingenious and diabolically clever by reviewers
- It has been adapted to stage, radio, film and television, and its been turned into a graphic novel and a computer game
- It has been translated to many other languages










CHARACTERS

The local doctor







WHEN & WHERE?


 The novel begins with Poirot and his faithful companion Captain Hastings arriving for a holiday in South England. They are staying in a Cornish resort in St Loo.








PLOT







Hercules Poirot comes across Miss Nick Buckley while taking a walk with Hastings. She starts describing her near death experiences. First, her car brakes failed. Then, a large rock just missed her when she was strolling, and a painting nearly fell on her while she was sleeping. After that Poirot notices a bullet hole in her hat. Nick is certainly in danger. Poirot decides to start investigating
Nick's mysterious accidents. At Poirot's
advice, Nick contacts her cousin Maggie
to stay with her for a few weeks. When
Maggie arrives, Nick hosts a party and
invites all her friends as well as Poirot and
Hastings. While everybody is enjoying
the fireworks in the garden, Nick and
Maggie go inside to freshen up.




After a couple of minutes, Maggie is found dead in the living room, wearing Nick's shawl. The murderer had once again missed.


Poirot gathers all the suspects in the dining room at End House in order to announce the conclusions he drew. Who do you think the murderer was?



• I thought the book was a real page-turner




• On the whole, it is well worth reading. I would absolutely recommend it to anyone who enjoys reading detective novels.




