


### "Gialina Giannena" by Michael Ganas

The place was surrounded by many mountains and brought forth its living creatures, good people and bad, weasels, foxes, a lake as far as the eye can see and castles underfoot.



# Analysis of the poem

"Gialina Giannena" is a poem about the place of Ioannina, the capital city of the Perfecture of Ioannina, where Konitsa, our small town is located.

The poem is in Greek but it is also translated in English.


The word "Giannena" is a colloquial term for the name of the city of loannina.

The word "Gialina" means "in glass" or "glassy" and it relates to the foggy and rainy weather of the city.

The narrator recalls the experiences of his childhood in Ioannina, Epirus. Mentally traveling to Ioannina, he describes the high mountains, the people, the animals, the lake, the castles, the minarets, and reflects on the history and culture of the place.

## Facts about Michael Ganas

- Michalis Ganas is a Greek poet and lyricist.
- He was born in Thesprotia, near loannina in 1944 and lived the first years of his life in Eastern European countries. He studied at the Law School of the University of Athens. He worked as a bookseller, an editor on television and radio programmes and as a copywriter.
