About Baku: The session is taking place in Baku, Azerbaijan as one could guess from the name of the session. Baku is a vibrant and cosmopolitan city, known for its beautiful architecture, rich history, and modern amenities. Some of the city's most famous landmarks include the iconic Flame Towers, the Maiden Tower, and the Palace of the Shirvanshahs. Baku is also home to a thriving arts and culture scene, with numerous museums, galleries, and performing arts venues. The city is truly a unique blend of the old and the new, with traditional Azerbaijani culture and customs coexisting alongside contemporary developments and trends.

Baku is often known as the "City of Wind" due to its location on the shores of the Caspian Sea. The city experiences strong winds that come in from the sea, which can make for a refreshing breeze on hot summer days. In fact, the name "Baku" is believed to have originated from the Old Persian word for "wind-pounded city." Two of the main winds in Baku are "Khazri" and "Gilavar". "Khazri" is the cold northern wind and "Gilavar" is the warm southern wind. They are often associated with the city's maritime history and its connection to the Caspian Sea. The winds are also sometimes mentioned in local folklore and literature, and they have inspired several works of art over the years.

About the session theme: The education system is something that immediately affects us as young people and will impact future generations and how they shape the world around them. When it comes to creating a system that would fully explore our potential, we think that the voices of young people are not being heard loudly enough. Sharing over 10 years of EYP experience in Azerbaijan, our National Committee's generations came together to work on a theme that has always brought us together and motivated us to move forward: building an educational system that fulfils the needs and demands of a world that is constantly changing. While the colors show the warmth that one is filled with while being in Azerbaijan. By taking a closer look at the logo, we can also notice that the pages take the shape of some of Baku's famous landmarks: Heydar Aliyev Center - A landmark taking the shape of an eternal cycle and waves symbolising connection between the past and the future. Flame Towers - A flame shaped towers, illustrating the adopted motto of Azerbaijan -"The Land of Fire" Additionally, the spelling of Baku 2023, is visualised with the shortened letter "U", emphasising the Azerbaijani spelling of the capital city - Bakı.




Dearest participants,

Dress code: Formal



It is better to check the weather reports for Baku during session dates before packing for the travel.







Casual: This entails almost any type of comfortable clothing that allows for free movement in activities such as teambuilding but can also serve for other informal events.

Smart: This is the golden middle way between formal and casual, usually associated with work and school environments. Smart style is mostly encouraged during committee work.

Formal: This style contains formal suits, shirts, skirts, trousers, and dresses in order to ensure a professional appearance. This dress code is mainly suggested during the general assembly and other evening events.

The overall intention behind these guidelines is to ensure that participants will dress respectfully and appropriately, bearing in mind the nature of each event and the people that will be attending. In no way does the aforementioned imply that a strict policy on clothing will be followed and we strongly discourage the use, purchase or acquisition of special items that you don't feel comfortable in.

Accommodation

Safety and Motes

Leaving during the official programme: All participants are expected to partake in all the official session activities listed in the Session Programme with the exception of emergencies or other urgent situations. We would like to remind all participants that this event consists of more than 200 people which entails a range of legal obligations and responsibilities for the Organising Team, therefore no participant is permitted to leave without the permission of an Organiser. Even with given permission delegates are still required to stay with an Organiser at all times. In no circumstances can a participant leave the Session without informing a member of the Organising team. Failure to follow this will result in the individual being excluded from the event and sent home at their own expense.

Alcohol and drug policy: The European Youth Parliament has a zero-tolerance policy on all drugs. The possession and usage of all types of drugs is considered illegal under Azerbaijani law. If any participant is found in possession of any drugs, they will immediately be removed from the session and sent home at their own expense. Possession of drugs will be reported to the local police and can result in measures taken by the local criminal and administrative offence laws.

The European Youth Parliament has a zero-tolerance policy on all drugs. The possession and usage of all types of drugs is considered illegal under Azerbaijani law. If any participant is found in possession of any drugs, they will immediately be removed from the session and sent home at their own expense. Possession of drugs will be reported to the local police and can result in measures taken by the local criminal and administrative offense laws.

Only alcoholic beverages under the threshold of 13% Alcohol by Volume will be permitted at the session to delegates over the age of 18. No Session participant should put themselves in a position in which they are unable to fulfil their duties or participate in the session programme due to overindulgence. The minimum legal age for purchasing and drinking alcohol in Azerbaijan is 18 years. There is a fine for selling and giving alcohol to persons under 18 years old.

Safety and Motes

Visa: If you are a citizen of a country who needs a visa for entry to Azerbaijan, it is highly recommended to apply for an e-visa through <u>evisa.gov.az</u>. You can check the list of eligible countries <u>here</u>. Check the Travel Booklet for more information.

Insurance: Travel insurance is not required officially by the government of Azerbaijan; however, it depends on personal preference and you are welcome to obtain one to cover your stay. We recommend you to check your insurance policy regarding coverage for medical expenses incurred abroad. Even in the absence of health insurance, medical assistance can still be obtained. Additionally, medical services in Baku are more budget-friendly compared to those in the European Union.

Welfare policy: The EYP has an extensive Welfare Policy for International Sessions, which covers rules regarding behavioural standards, e.g. discrimination, abuse (of trust), (sexual) harassment, violence, consent and child protection. Should the unfortunate event ever occur in which behavioural standards are not met, whether with regards to you or another participant, please do not hesitate to contact any official at the session. All officials have been briefed on how to support you in such a situation. Officials, in turn, are supported in these efforts by the appointed Safe Person of the session. You are also always free to contact the Safe Person directly with any issues or questions. Information about the assigned Safe Person will be given at the session.

Currency exchange: It is important to remember that the currency of Azerbaijan is Azerbaijani Manat (AZN). While making the payment credit cards can be used; however, it is essential to consider that the percentage of exchange will be added to the transaction. Additionally, it is possible to exchange EUROs to AZN at the airport or in the city center.
