- If the main part of the sentence is positive, we add a \_\_\_\_\_ question tag.
- If the main part of the sentence is negative, we add a \_\_\_\_\_ question tag.
- If the sentence contains an \_\_\_\_\_ verb or modal verb, we use that for the question tag.
- The other exception is the verb \_\_\_\_\_ – we use that for the question tag if it appears in the main part of the sentence.
- If the main part of the sentence contains a different verb, we make the question tag using \_\_\_\_\_, in the correct form.
