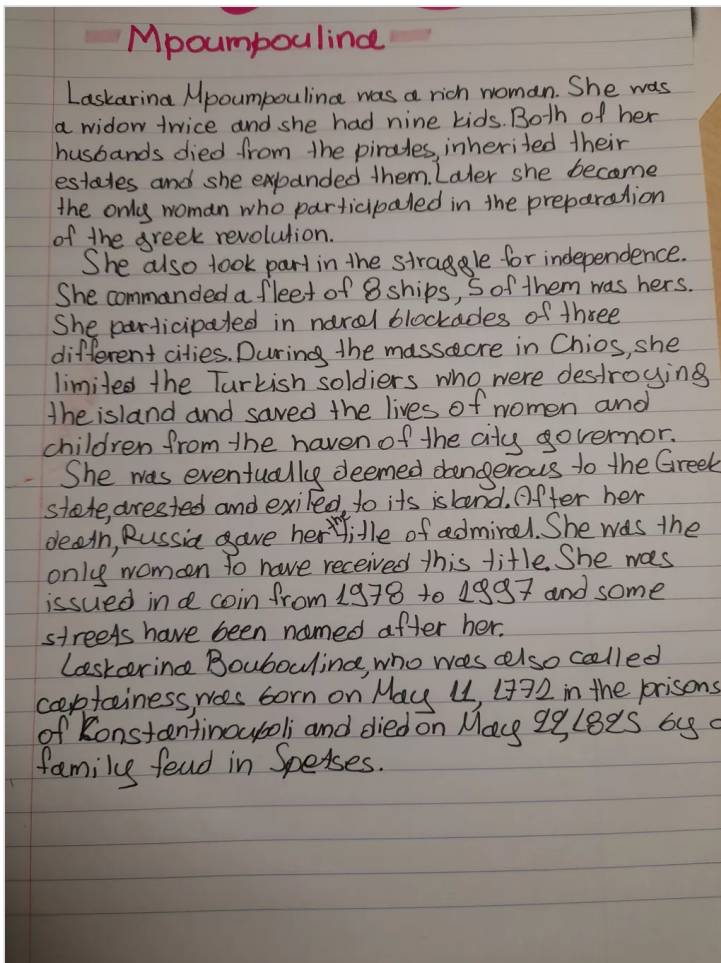

then to Dimitris Bouboulis from whom she derived the name "Bouboulina". Both of her husbands who were captains were killed during pirate raids. After that, Bouboulina was left with an immense fortune from her two husbands and her seven children. Later, she became a member of Filiki Eteria. In 1825 Laskarina Bouboulina was killed in a fight with the Koutsis family whose daughter and Bouboulina's son ran away together. While explaining to the family what had happened she was shot in the head and died in an instant.

After that tragic death the Russian Empire gave her the honorary ranking of admiral in the Russian Navy at the time, she was the only woman in history to hold this title.

Today, she is remembered as a Greek national hero. Without her the Greeks might never have gained their independence. In addition, various streets have been named after her in Greece today, a mark of the true admiration that the Greek people feel for her.

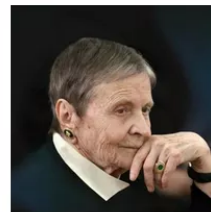

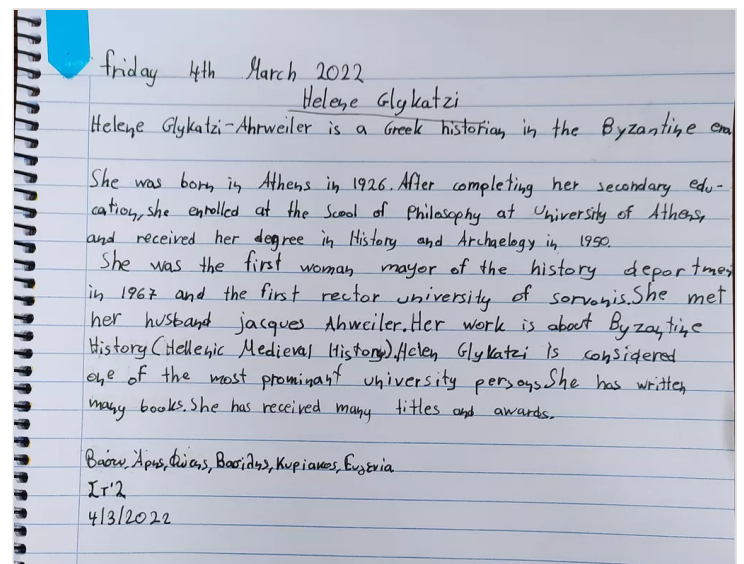
