#### Laskarina Bouboulina

## Mpoumpoulind Laskarina Mpoumpoulina was a nich woman. She was a widow twice and she had nine kids Both of her husbands died from the pirates, inherited their estates and she expanded them. Later she became the only woman who participaled in the preparation of the greek revolution. She also took part in the straggle for independence. She commanded a fleet of 8 ships, 5 of them was hers. She participated in naral blockades of three different cities. During the massacre in Chios, she limited the Turkish soldiers who were destroying the island and saved the lives of nomen and children from the naven of the city governor. She was eventually deemed dangerous to the Greek state, are eted and exiled, to its island. Often her death, Russia gave her litle of admiral. She was the only woman to have received this title. She was issued in a coin from 1978 to 1997 and some streets have been named after her. Laskarina Bouboulina, who was also called captainess, was form on May 11, 1772 in the prisons of Konstantinoupoli and died on May 28, 1825 by o family feud in Speases.

then to Dimitris Bouboulis from whom she derived the name "Bouboulina". Both of her husbands who were captains were killed during pirate raids. After that, Bouboulina was left with an immense fortune from her two husbands and her seven children. Later, she became a member of Filiki Eteria. In 1825 Laskarina Bouboulina was killed in a fight with the Koutsis family whose daughter and Bouboulina's son ran away together. While explaining to the family what had happened she was shot in the head and died in an instant.

After that tragic death the Russian Empire gave her the honorary ranking of admiral in the Russian Navy at the time, she was the only woman in history to hold this title.

Today, she is remembered as a Greek national hero. Without her the Greeks might never have gained their independence. In addition, various streets have been named after her in Greece today, a mark of the true admiration that the Greek people feel for her.
